### **INFORMATION FOR APRIL BEGINNERS PROGRAMME**

### **Australian Native Orchids**

This is one of the largest genus and also the most popular with enthusiasts throughout the world. Australian Natives are very easy to grow and usually will flower within two years from seedlings approximately six months old. Easy to care for and grow very well in South Australian conditions. They do not take too long to become a specimen plant. Some can be mounted but a little more care is required, they need more water because they tend to dry out quickly, best to keep them damp. Several different mounts can be used – Melaleuca, Tree Fern, Cork etc.

Potted in small bark only is okay but you can add to this purlite, marble chips etc. this will help to let air through to the roots and allows water to run through. They do not like a lot of fertilizer as this will tend to make the foliage limp and of course not many flowers. Several different fertilizers such as Nutricote, Osmocote, Neutrog, Aquasol to name a few. Also available is a special blend of fertilizer especially made for Australian Natives this is Horticultural Solutions HS08 made in Queensland, and is available in S.A. from Smoults. Do not forget to fertilize regularly.

There are still a few pests such as snails, slugs, caterpillars (Woolly Bears), red spider, mealy bug etc. When using sprays please read the label and take care. Dipel is a good systemic spray for snails, slugs, caterpillars etc. Rogar for red spider, Folimat for mealy bugs.

There have been a few name changes in recent years mainly from Dendrobium to Dockrillia. Mainly terete leave species are affected. To name a few:

Dendrobium teretifolium - Dockrillia teretifolia
Dendrobium striolata - Dockrillia striolata
Dendrobium bowmanii - Dockrillia bowmanii
Dendrobium calamiforme - Dockrillia calamiformis
Dendrobium linguiforme - Dockrillia linguiformis

Sarcochilus is another genus that is reasonably easy to grow in South Australia. It requires similar conditions to Dendrobiums. Australian Natives are very rewarding, easy to flower, good to have some in your collection.

# South Coast Orchid Club - Benched plants, April 2008 Meeting

Best in Open Division and Flower of the Night: Dendrochilum uncatum benched by Ron & Irene Parish. This is a species from the Philippines and Taiwan and grows at altitudes of 900 to 2500 metres. The plant carried 14 arching pendulous inflorescences nicely arranged around it. The distal 6cm to 8cm of the inflorescences carried two many-flowered rows of tiny yellow flowers along it.

<u>Best in First Division:</u> *Slc.* Summer Magic benched by Suzanne Saunders, a reasonably large plant with a single inflorescence carrying two flowers 70mm wide and 90mm high. There are 18 different

species, 14 *Cattleya spp.*, 3 *Laelia spp.* and a large contribution (31%) *Soph. coccinia* which would have had a significant influence on the vibrant pink colour of the sepals and petals, the latter had deep maroon tips and bright yellow centres nearer their bases. The labellum was bright yellow at the base with pink shading on the edges of the side lobes and a deep purple-pink mid-lobe.

<u>Best in Second Division:</u> Rossioglossum grande benched by Ruth and Gunter Eckhard. A small plant with one





inflorescence carrying four flowers some 100mm wide and 120mm high. Sepals and petals had brown markings on a greenish-yellow base. Sepals barred brown, petals solid brown for the two thirds nearest the centre of the flower becoming clear yellow towards their ends. The cream labellum was barred light brown on the midlobe.

### A few other plants benched by members:

### Open Division.

Sartylis (Srts.) Toowoomba Sparkle 'Coconut Ice' benched by Peter and Geraldine Flavel. Srts. is made up of two genera, Sarcochilus and Rhyncostylis and this hybrid has the typical single growth habit with leaves up the stem and inflorescences produced from the bases of the leaves progressively up the stem as seen in both genera. The inflorescence had 24 open flowers and buds still to open. Flowers were 25mm wide and 35mm tale, had creamy-white sepals and petals finely spotted pinkish-purple on their inner halves. The small scoop like labellum was deep purple on the inside.





### First Division.

Milt. cogniauxiae grown by Rito Silvestri. A very large plant with some 24 inflorescences, a pro-


gressive flowerer, most inflorescences having two flowers open and a large proportion having buds still to open. Flowers were some 70mm to 80mm wide and 80mm high with narrow sepals approximately 8mm wide, petals 10 to 12mm wide and a showy labellum 30mm wide and 35mm long. All flower segments were deep purple, the labellum providing a contrast, shading paler towards the periphery.



### Second Division.

Pot. Hoku Gem 'Freckles' benched by Brian and Moyna Leedham. A complex hybrid with Brassovola, Cattleya, Laelia and Sophronitis in it's background, Soph. coccinia (31%) and

L. milleri (25%) having a major influence on the orangered colour of the flowers and the narrow segments of *L*. milleri on their shape. Flowers were 60 to 65mm wide and 90mm high with orange-red sepals and petals with darker red spotting and a yellow labellum with red spottina.
