TROPHY AND THE HISTORY BEHIND THE TROPHY A.O.C. HIGHEST AGG POINTS won by B & J Gay

Elsie Chisholm Trophy for Cymbidiums 60 to 90mm—won by H Gerber (This was our first Trophy donated in 1980 for best novelty Cymbidium now 60 to 90mm. Elsie's nickname was Chiz, she joined the Club in the late 60's. Chiz passed away while looking after her orchids in her flowering house with her arms around an orchid plant. Her husband, Rod was a war veteran and spent his last days at Magill Nursing Home).

State Bank Trophy - Champions and Best in Division - won by M Guy

Roy Hill Trophy Champion Native Cymbidium Winter Show—won by P and G Flavel (Roy became a member in the late 70's. We can't find much information about him except he loved his native Cymbidiums and worked very hard for the Club).

John Leeder Trophy - Best odontoglossum / Oncidium Alliance - won by J and R McRedmond (John Leeder worked very hard for our Club. He was on the committee for many years, his positions included secretary and president).

Steven Gamble Trophy for Australian Natives - won by K and D Cammack (Steven, a teenage member of South Coast Orchid Club loved Australian Natives and Terrestrials. The Trophy was donated in his name when he passed away in 1987).

W.A. Young Trophy - Champion Phalaenopsis Spring Show - won by M Young (W A Young shade house etc business in St Marys).

Glen Forest Trophy for Species Paphiopedilums - won by R and I Parish (Glen joined South Coast in the very early days and his first love was Cymbidiums and also grew other genera).

Lewis Moore Trophy - Highest Agg. Points for Australian Epiphytes - won by B and J Gay (Rosalie donated a tray in 1999, in memory of Lewis who died in 1989. He was on the committee along with Rosalie for many years. Both were judges and Lewis was Treasurer, both loved S.C.O.C. and worked very hard for the Club).

Harry Viney Trophy - Champion Cattleya Autumn Show (Donated by Berna Viney in memory of Harrison. 'Harry" worked tirelessly for the Club over many years, and he held many positions including president.

Clock Trophy - Champion Winter Show - won by H Grund (This was donated by Helen and Charlie Edwards. Helen is a life member and was convenor of the Daytime Group. They both worked hard for the Club).

M NG Memorial Trophy - Australian Native Hybrid - Most Floriferous Plant in Spring Show - won by M Young (Donated by Sylvester Ng in memory of his brother who passed away in his early fifties).

P C Loke Trophy - Species Group - won by R Shooter (Donated by Sylvester Ng in memory of his late cousin who passed away in his mid fifties).

L and R Moore Trophy - Annual Aggregate for Australian Epiphytic Orchids - won by K and D Cammack (Rosalie and Lewis worked tirelessly for the club and were both Judges. Lewis passed away in '89 and Rosalie in early 2002.

SPECIES GROUP

On the hottest day of the year so far (40c plus), 22 hardy orchid species enthusiasts from the Club met at Ron & Irene's home for a B.B.Q, a chance for some friendly intercourse with like-minded friends and to look at some lovely species.

Considering the weather there was a good selection of orchids brought in, 19 in total. As usual some like *Sigmatostalix radicans*, a species endemic to Brazil, had tiny 5mm white & yellow flowers produced on 120mm tall racemes. This species is not difficult to flower and because of its rambling nature is best grown either mounted or in shallow pots.

At the other end of the size spectrum was a lovely, large plant of *Cattleya leopoldii*, a tall plant with 60cm tall pseudobulbs carrying a head of deep green flowers with numerous brown red spots and a bright magenta labellum a truly magnificent orchid. Exhibited alongside this orchid was *Cattleya guttata*, a similar but smaller species the flowers have the same colour and markings as *C leopoldii* in fact some

botanists describe C leopoldii as a variety of C guttata.

Another Cattleya displayed was *C harrisonii* closely related to *C lod-digesii* of which it is often described as a variety of that species. This plant was mounted on a log and was extremely healthy with roots running all over the mount however it had just about reached the extremity of its host and will present the owner a problem when it comes to remount or pot it. It is a species with long lasting, lilac/rose coloured flowers about 100mm across, highly fragrant during the warmer periods of the day. The three Cattleyas described above belong to the subtribe Laeliinae growing in

tropical South America but can be cultivated quite easily under shade house conditions in Adelaide.

Also from the subtribe Laeliinae is *Rhyncholaelia digbyana Syn Brassavola digbyana* native to South America its outstanding feature is its large single lemon scented, light green petals and sepals

with a round white frilled lip. This species has been used extensively in hybridising to produce progeny with frilly lips. To flower this species in Adelaide give it as bright light as possible short of burning with ample watering and fertilising. It is worth growing for the perfume alone.

A plant of *Gongora galeata* with a pendulous raceme of solid gold short lasting strangely shaped flowers was exhibited. The flowers rarely last more than a week or two and do not wither on the spike but drop

off when they are still in good condition. This is an interesting genus consisting of around 80 species from Mexico, Peru & Brazil requiring some heat during our winter months to flower successfully.

Other plants benched were; Phalaenopsis pulchra, Phal pallens, Phal fasciata, Epidendrum capricornu, Epidendrum elongatum, Pleurothallis prolifera, Lycaste aromatica, Octomeria gracilus, Octomeria grandiflora, Scaphosepalum antenniferm,

Maxillaria teretifolia, Dockrillia cucumerina, Sarcochilus ceciliae. Reg Shooter

On the Bench at the February Meeting

Flower of Open Division: Angraecum Longiscott 'Hihimanu' benched by Peter and Geraldine Flavel. A nicely grown plant carrying three inflorescences, each with a number of flowers typical in form for the species. The prominent flat labellum with rounded side-lobes came to a point at the mid-lobe, was white in colour and had a long tail tinged with green. The narrow sepals and petals were also white with a slight greenish tinge.





Flower of First Division: Encyclia cochleata benched by Heather Engelhardt. The large plant carried three inflorescences with flowers that typically have the appearance of being 'upside down'. The pale cream sepals and petals reflexed back down around the petiole while the labellum pointed upwards. The labellum had a base colour of pale green veined and edged with deep purple and had two solid spots either side of its midline.

Flower of Second Division and Flower of the Night: Promenaea (Prom.) Florafest Cheetah benched by Tony and Lynn Fisher was a nicely grown small plant with a single flower that was 55mm across and 35mm high. The creamish yellow sepals and petals were spotted with purplish red and balanced by the creamish yellow labellum which was heavily spotted towards its base in the same colour as the other segments.



The display last month was small it was not the main season for flowering our plants. There was a total of 26 plants in Open Division, two in First and seven in Second Divisions. Congratulations to growers who benched their plants. A few other plants shown at the meeting:

Open Division.

Bev and John Gay benched a very nice plant of the intergeneric *Howeara* (*Hwra.*) Lava Burst. A smallish plant it carried two long arching inflorescences with side branches. The numerous flowers were generally arranged in two rows making an attractive display. Sepals and petals were crimson with some yellow at their base and the prominent labellum was orangered in colour with yellow along the sides and that the base.



Benched by Peter and Geraldine Flavel was a plant of *C*. Valentine Day 'Osborne'. It carried a single inflorescence of 13 flowers 70mm wide by 90mm long and evenly arranged around the stem. The glossy brownish maroon sepals and petals shaded to a slightly paler shade at their base and the prominent 'shovel' shaped labellum had a deep purple red mid-lobe flanked by side-lobes of cream tinged pink which folded up over the cream column.

First Division.

Paph. (superbiens x Jolly Roger) also benched by Heather Engelhardt. A very deep maroon novelty slipper orchid, It had dark maroon striping on its dorsal sepal, narrow downswept deep maroon petals which had nodules bearing hairs along the top edges and a pale greenish stripe along the mid-line and hairs along their lower edges. The long narrow labellum or pouch was deep maroon in colour.

Second Division.

Onc. flexuosum grown by Judy and Rod McRedmond. A well grown plant mounted on a piece of tree fern. It carried five branched inflorescences of typical yellow 'dancing lady' flowers with prominent yellow labellum with brown spotting at its base together with small yellow sepals and petals which were also spotted in light brown.

Jean Irvine benched a very nice example of a 'crucifix orchid', *Epidendrum* Salmon King. Two of the plant's canes carried apical inflorescences having flower heads of 40mm wide by 37mm high flowers. The sepals and petals were salmon in colour and the labellum, in the shape of a cross giving the plant its common name, a slightly paler shade of the same tone and yellow at its centre.
