SAROC now has a venue at Pulteney Grammar School, 190 South Terrace, Adelaide, for their Annual SAROC Fair. I know this is more convenient to most members who show and believe it has much better lighting. Date - June 9<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> June 2007. Lucy has rung most members who show and they have agreed to show this year, so arrangements are on the way.

Other dates on my calendar, that I hope to attend are the Country Challenge at Ballarat on 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> July, plus the Conference at Ararat on 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> September. It is always a fun weekend.

Proposal to rename the South Brighton Community Hall the Lou Kesting Hall Lou Kesting was a most influential community leader in the South Brighton area in the period immediately after WW2. This was a time of rapid change from a largely rural area to a built-up residential area. During this time of flux, Lou was a catalyst in the creation of community facilities for the new residents.

Lou was an active member of the Dover Square Improvement Committee. With the growing number of children from the young families in the new houses, the need for a preschool kindergarten became urgent. The nearest kindergarten was at Hove which was too remote for local children. Lou turned his energies to meeting this need. Land for a kindergarten was bought with funds raised by local parents and friends. Materials for the proposed building were largely donated by local firms and businesses,. Building work was started and the 'the Secretary of the Dover Square improvement Committee, L Kesting, coordinated the work of 110 men who volunteered their labor' (Averil Holt's *The Vanishing Sands*). The Kindergarten was opened in 1955.

Lou next turned his energy to providing a recreation centre for the people of the South Brighton area. With the net-work of volunteers from the kindergarten project, a Men's Club was formed in 1955 for this purpose. Foundations for a hall were poured with voluntary labor on land held by the Brighton Council. However, this Club's support base was too small and it closed in September 1958.

To further the proposal for a communal meeting place, the South Brighton Community Association was formed in the following month. To raise funds to complete the hall, the Association enlarged its area of operation and introduced a Foundation Membership scheme. Collectors from each street gathered regular installments from 300 foundation members for a total of 5 pounds per family. Lou not only did much of the work in recruiting collectors and members but also maintained strict control of the incoming funds.

To speed the commencement of building work, Lou persuaded several public-spirited citizens to make temporary loans to be repaid from the funds being collected from members. These loans were indicative of the trust inspired by Lou. Work was started in 1959 to build a hall on the existing foundations. The Hall was completed in 1960 and officially opened by the Mayor of Brighton, Jack Green.

While the hall was being built, Lou canvassed potential users for the new hall. Several large local organisations such as the Dutch Reformed Church met there for several years until they could build their own premises.

Another deep interest of Lou was the preservation of some of the rapidly disappearing open space in the South Brighton area. With the support of others, he successfully lobbied for the acquisition of land to enlarge the Dover Square area, for the closure of a road between the Square and Folkestone Road and for the restriction of traffic on the Broadway on the southern side of Dover Square. These actions allowed the construction of four tennis courts between Dover Square and Folkestone Road for the use of the Dover Square Tennis Club. The relocation of the courts allowed Dover Square to be redeveloped as communal open space and children's playing area. An addition to the hall provided an extra hall for community use and as a permanent Club-room for the Tennis Club.

In all this activity, Lou was the driving force. While many other public-spirited and hardworking people helped with these projects, it was Lou's persistence and vision that maintained the momentum. He was an active member and co-ordinating force in all the organisations involved in this development of the Dover Square area.

For a man who did so much for the people of South Brighton, it is fitting that his name should be preserved by renaming the South Brighton Community Hall, which exists largely through his efforts, as the Lou Kesting Hall.

Perhaps if you incorporate pearlite this will hold the mix more open and possibly work for you.

Now is the exciting time for all Cymbidium growers. Bring along your early flowering plants and let us all see your growing results. Winter Show is in July - the peak of Cymbidium time. Pick out what you think is going to be your best plant and nurture it to flower to perfection, this is how you will achieve great plant to show and enjoy these wonderful blooms. Remember please, snail bait for snails (be careful with your pets). A trick of the trade is to put snail bait in a small piece of water pipe. It keeps it dry and away from your pets. Keep fertilizing on a regular basis, place a stake by elongated spikes to keep them straight. When placing twisties on make sure they are not too tight, otherwise you will get kinks in your spikes.

### On the Bench at the March Meeting

**Flower of Open Division:** Onc. Sweet Sugar 'Angel' benched by Geraldine and Peter Flavel. A small plant with one large much branched inflorescence that carried 46 open flowers and several buds. The flowers were 40mm across at their widest point and



40mm tall. They were typical Oncidium flowers with a broad yellow labellum and small yellow sepals marked with light brown. One parent of this hybrid is the species *Onc. varicosum* and the other parent is the complex hybrid *Onc.* Aloha Iwanagara which also has a large component of the same species in its breeding.

Flower of First Division and Flower of the Night: C. Caudebec x Sc. Batemanniana

grown by Suzanne Saunders. A well grown plant with three flowering leads, two carrying five flowers and the other with three. The flowers were 60mm across and 70mm high with light pink sepals spotted in deep purple contrasting with the dark purple petals and flat labellum, the side lobes of which were pale pink and sat against the bases of the petals providing an attractive contrast.



**Flower of Second Division:** *Slc.* Dal's Luck, a first flowering seedling, benched by Anne and Colin Campbell. The well shaped single flower measured 70mm by 70mm and had bright orange-red sepals and petals complimented by the labellum of a deeper shade of red with yellow at its base and dark red radial venation. This very attractive hybrid is highly influenced both in colour and shape



by the species *S. coccinea*, the pod parent having 62.5% of that species in its background and the pollen parent having 50% *S. coccinea*.

### Open Division.

There were two well grown plants of *Lc.* Mary Elizabeth Bohn 'Royal Flame' benched in Open Division, one grown by Richard and Beryl Wilson and the other by Peter and Geraldine Flavel. The narrow sepals were light lavender and the wider petals were slightly deeper purple with darker purple shading (the purple shading of one benched by the Flavels was somewhat darker and more emphasized, highlighting the central vein). The side-lobes of the labellum (of similar colour to the deep purple of the petals) curved up covering the column and the whole flowers were balanced by the large round deep purple mid-lobe of the labellum.

Gerald Voskamp benched a very nice well grown plant of *Den. bigibbum*. The plant carried six main inflorescences, two with most of the flowers open and the other four starting to open or still in bud. The flowers were 65mm wide and 50mm wide with purple narrow sepals broad petals and labellum, the base of the labellum much darker. It was good to see a well grown example of this important species so widely used in breeding with both exotic and Australian native Dendrobiums on our monthly meeting show bench.

### First Division.

A very nice well grown plant of the species  $\mathcal{C}$ . bicolor was benched by Suzanne Saunders. The plant had tall canes with the lead cane carrying an inflorescence of eight flowers 90mm wide and about 85mm high. The sepals and petals were greenish brown, green at the tips and very finely edged in white. The flat purple labellum was also edged with white.

Merv and Shirley Steele benched another example of the Laeliinae, *Blc.* Mount Isa 'Deborah', a complex hybrid with 14 different species in its background, the most dominant being 43.75% *C. dowiana*. The plant carried two flowers on a single inflorescence. The sepals and petals were deep maroon with the petals lightly frilled around the edge and the large showy very dark maroon labellum was veined in deep yellow at the base, a very attractive deeply coloured flower.

### Second Division.

C. Kew was benched by John Dunn. This was a non-standard cluster with one of the inflorescence carrying 12 flowers 85mm wide and high. Sepals and petals were deep lavender pink all over while the labellum was deeper lavender with cream at its base and the side lobes curved up over the column.

John also benched a sample of the terrete Australian native species, *Den. bowmanii* growing on a wooden log. The flowers, produced one or two per inflorescence from the base of the leaves, had cream to light yellow sepals and petals and a creamish white labellum.
