You will see from the statements enclosed with this Gazette, that our Club has enjoyed a successful year.

Once again our Autumn, Winter and Spring shows have all returned a good profit thanks to the hard work of President Geoff, Secretary Lucy and Dorothy Carassai.

This year the Club's Term Deposit investment has been increased from \$10,000.00 to \$12,001.54.

During 2011 our Club has purchased 2 new laptop computers together with computer bags and appropriate software. We have also acquired a new printer, screen and guillotine. Six folding tables have also been purchased. These tables are lighter than the heavy wooden tables and make it easier for members to help set up and pack up on meeting nights.

Our Club continues to subsidize social events and to award members with prizes, ribbons, trophies and prize money.



December Plant Commentary

First Division and Flower of the Night: *Epi.* Topez Rose 'Opal' benched by Pauline and Mark Hockey. A very well grown plant bearing three infloresences which carried very well shaped and colourful flowers with 15, 15 and 11open ones and still more buds to open. Sepals and petals were strong red and the labellum was yellow with deeper red around the edge of the mid-lobe. A very striking plant.





Open Division: *Phrag.* Grande 'Chinaman' benched by Peter and Geraldine Flavel. A large well grown plant with a single inflorescence bearing two flowers. One flower, with the longest petals being approximately 300mm long, would have been the first to open. The sepals had red-brown markings on a pale green base. The labellum was brown-red with spotting near the centre of the flower.





Second Division: *Phal.* Unknown 'Fantastic' benched by Michael Willoughby and Oui Ju. A very well grown plant with flowers 90mm across by 80mm tall and a single inflorescence with 4 branches carrying 7, 7, 7 and 11 flowers. The sepals and petals were purple-pink and were highlighted by the much deeper pink-purple labellum.
